

A year to go! Countdown starts for return of World Land Speed Record Sunbeam 1000hp to Daytona

The National Motor Museum, Beaulieu, tells us...

The countdown is on for the first car to break the 200mph World Land Speed Record to return to Daytona Beach a centenary after it set the amazing breakthrough there on the 29th March 1927.



The workshop team at the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu, England is focused on completing its challenging restoration of the iconic Sunbeam 1000hp, and the car is set to return to Daytona where it will be displayed on loan at the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America in January 2027. It will then make its long-awaited 100-year anniversary return to Daytona beach for a low-speed re-enactment of Major Henry Segrave's 203.792 mph World Land Speed Record.

"The Sunbeam 1000hp's return to Daytona will be a great celebration of the car's restoration project," says Jon Murden, the National Motor Museum's Chief Executive. "This will be the Sunbeam 1000's final stop after making its post-restoration debut at the 2026 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance in California and being on display at the Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles. In a year's time, motoring enthusiasts will be given a once-in-a-lifetime chance to see the car as it attempts a centennial run at Daytona on the 29 March 2027."

The legendary vehicle's front 22.4 litre Matabele V12 aero engine is currently being restored at the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu in Hampshire, England. Reaching Daytona will be the culmination of years of restoration - a campaign to get the British engineering icon back to working order in time for the centenary celebration. Significant milestones have been met, including having the colossal rear engine roar to life once again last September.

Daren Lucas, President, Motorsports Hall of Fame of America says, "We are honoured to welcome the Sunbeam 1000 to the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America. This iconic vehicle represents a pivotal moment in land speed record history and having it on display in the museum allows us to share that story with our visitors. It's a unique opportunity for guests to experience up close a machine that helped push the boundaries of speed and performance and make motorsports history right here in Daytona Beach."

Lori Campbell Baker, Executive Director, Daytona Beach Area Convention & Visitors Bureau says, "The return of the Sunbeam 1000 to Daytona Beach is a powerful tribute to our rich



motorsports heritage of the Daytona Beach area and the role our area beaches played in shaping racing history. Seeing this legendary vehicle back on the very sands where it once made history will be a memorable moment for both the community and visitors. The ceremonial drive and its display at the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America offer a rare opportunity to connect with this historic and innovative vehicle.”

The National Motor Museum at Beaulieu last year announced it is partnering with CARS (Classic Automotive Relocation Services) who as its ‘Exclusive Logistics Partner’ will transport the iconic Sunbeam 1000hp to venues in the USA. Restoration of the car has been supported by hundreds of individuals and companies*
