



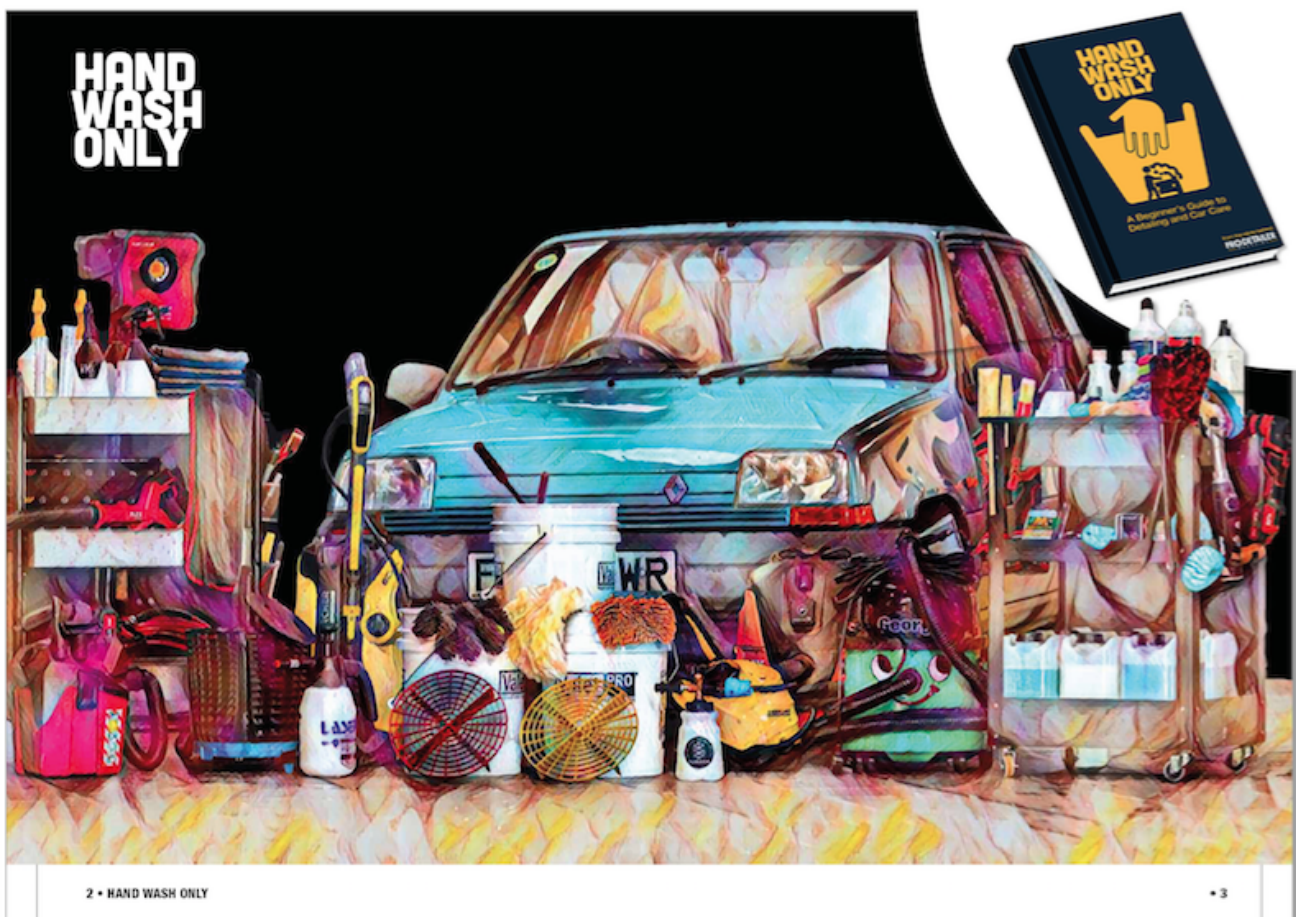

So what is the book all about?

We review the book, but first The publishers of 'Hand Wash Only' tell us...

Car enthusiasts all over the world know that washing their vehicle by hand is the best way to keep it looking its best.

In recent times 'detailing' has become the buzz word in the world of car washing - a term that describes car care best practice. Now a new book seeks to demystify the processes offering an essential guide for any car lover.

WAX

Wax was the first form of paint protection and it predates the invention of the car, and indeed even the invention of car paint itself.

Wax is essentially a non-soluble solid substance that becomes liquid with heated and then becomes a solid again when cooled. Wax occurs in nature, but humans have learnt to modify it for preferential properties, and synthesise it entirely to the same end.

There are organic car waxes ('organic' wax refers to the wax content of a wax-based product – there are other ingredients such as solvents and carrier solutions that aren't always organic per se – you can't harvest wax and put it in a pot unprocessed) and what we call 'hybrid' waxes, which mix synthetic and organic ingredients.

Waxes have been around longer than the car though they were commoditised in the 1950s.


Wholly synthetic products come under the polymer sealant category, despite often being marketed as waxes. Most waxes are sold as a solid paste of varying hardness, but there are also 'liquid' emulsion waxes with a thick consistency and 'spray waxes', which are generally thinner.


Liquid waxes are often quicker to apply but generally contain less organic wax, so are usually synthetic hybrids.

More recent waxes blend organic and synthetic active ingredients, referred to as 'hybrid' waxes.

Dodo Juice Blue Velvet contains beeswax and Carnauba, it is a classic 'organic' wax.

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Published by PD Publishing, written by Bert Youell and edited by Ian Sealey of PRO Detailer Magazine, 'Hand Wash Only' provides an answer to the question of how the term 'detailing' first entered the automotive vernacular in the mid-2000s and offers an easy-to-understand explanation into the equipment and products used, and every stage of the various processes involved.

With essential kit in hand, readers are guided through each important stage of detailing, from the wash process as a whole to the finer points of decontamination, paint polishing, paint protection, interior cleaning, and anything else designed to make a car look great.

It is a commonly-held thought that cosmetic maintenance of/attention to car bodywork involves a quick wash and perhaps a 'shine-up' to make the vehicle look its best... However, there's far more to it than that, and the 'Hand Wash Only' book explains step-by-step, and in detail, how to make a much more comprehensive job of 'detailing'.

There are many definitions of detailing (which in fact is big business these days), but in essence the term relates not just to what you are doing to the vehicle, to really make it stand out as a pristine example, but also to *how* you are doing it.

I have spent an enjoyable few hours reading the book, which I found easy to study, and was pleased to find that it has been written with humour as well as covering the subject matter in-depth. An example is that on the front cover the authors, Bert Youell and Ian Sealey, refer to themselves as 'The idiots behind PRO Detailer magazine'. However, far from idiocy, their knowledge and experience has resulted in a brilliant publication that can help anyone - whether new to detailing or an old hand - to improve their vehicle and make it a class apart from others.

Within the book's 144 pages they cover the vast array of products available for obtaining a top-class finish to a vehicle, inside and out, and importantly they explain the methodology required to get the best from the materials chosen.

Separate sections cover equipment essentials, the washing and 'decontamination' processes, paint polishing and protection, interior work, etc. In each case the various aspects - some of which could be quite complex to grasp for someone new to the game - are



carefully and logically explained.
