New exhibition opens - “The Gallery: Auto Art at The British Motor Museum”.

The British Motor Museum has opened a brand-new exhibition entitled “*The Gallery: Auto Art at the British Motor Museum*”, which will run until 30 June 2023. The exhibition, which



is run in collaboration with Historic Car Art, features a collection of over 30 motoring-related pieces from seven of Britain's most creative automotive artists and sculptors.

The Gallery showcases five leading artists - Simon Britnell, Neil Collins, Adam Gompertz, John Ketchell, and Andy Shore, who work with a variety of media, including acrylics, oil, watercolour, pen, and pastels. Alongside the evocative paintings, Jonny Ambrose and Gary Smith bring their eye-catching sculptures to the exhibition, artwork created in wood and in bronze.
