

Sun-drenched Dorset Delight

The magnificent, five day long Great Dorset Steam Fair is a huge annual event that takes place every August on a 600 acre site at Tarrant Hinton near Blandford Forum, and in the presence of approximately 200,000 people.

This year's event – the 49^{th} – was held a few weeks ago and lived up to its deserved



reputation for providing 'something for everyone'. In fact it is one of the largest outdoor historic 'nostalgia' events in the world, showcasing Britain's heritage in terms of industry agriculture and vehicles, and with as many as possible of the machines actually working/operating during the Show.

While I cannot claim to have attended every one of these events, I have only missed one since 1971, and always enjoy the wide variety of historic exhibits and the unique atmosphere of this Show.

This year, once again, the exhibits included one of the largest and most spectacular line-ups of steam-powered traction engines and road rollers seen anywhere on earth, several hundred historic commercial vehicles, and a fascinating selection of cars, dating from the earliest days of motoring to the early 1980s.

Adding interest to the car section of the show were many classic caravans, dating from the 1920s to the 1970s; shown below is the brilliant '1967' themed display of car (MGB), caravan and music set up by John and Heather Knott.





In addition to the vehicles there were superbly turned out shire horses, a multitude of tractors and stationary engines, historic road building displays, 'dancing' sheep and also birds of prey, in addition to dog agility demonstrations, wood cutting displays, bicycles, an impressive model tent, and a fairground with many steam-driven rides.
